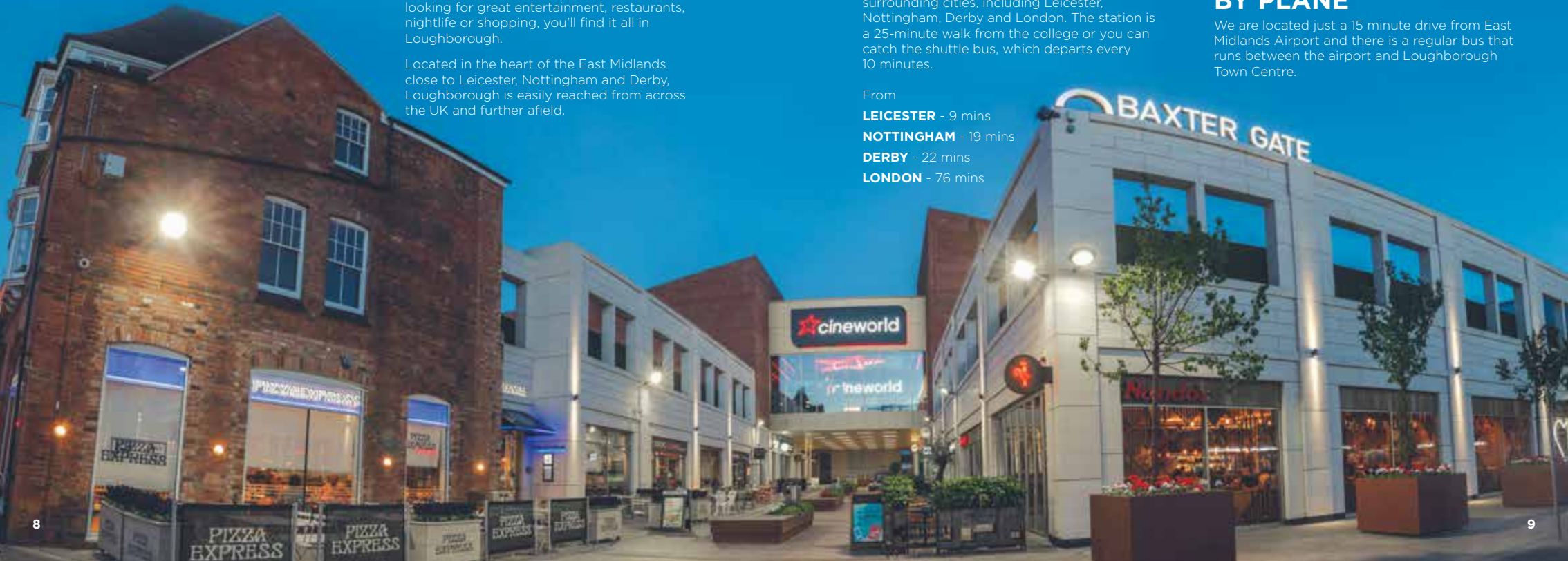

# CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

Our campus and facilities are designed to help you make the most of your experience and support your learning. We are located on the edge of the town centre, just across the road from Loughborough University.

## DEDICATED UNDERGRADUATE CENTRE

The Undergraduate Centre is a dedicated space used by our university-level learners to conduct their studies. Designed to meet the teaching, learning and social needs required for Higher Education study, you will have access to the computers, breakout areas and lecture rooms in this specialised facility.

## EXERCISE PHYSIOLOGY LABORATORIES

Our state-of-the-art physiology lab is equipped with high spec treadmills and exercise ergometers, allowing Sport students to gain an applied insight into the physiological changes associated with exercise.

The lab is also equipped for gas analysis, haematological assessment and measures of hydration, as well as body composition techniques. High-speed cameras and a pressure plate also allow for analysis of human performance from a biomechanical perspective.



## ARTS ACADEMY

The Arts Academy is a new development designed to provide top-level facilities to those looking to work in the creative industries. Undergraduate students studying Music will have access to our new, industry standard recording studios, packed with state-of-the-art equipment, as well as fantastic rehearsal spaces for you to develop your skills.



## ENGINEERING LABORATORIES

Our engineering laboratories are of an excellent standard and include the highest specification jet engines, 3D printer, electronic testing devices such as Programmable Logic Controllers (PLCs) and a spectrum analyser.

Undergraduate students on our Engineering courses will be able to use these state-of-the-art facilities for hands-on learning, putting their skills into practice and gaining vital industry experience.



## LIBRARY

Our Library offers a range of drop-in and bookable computer facilities in a variety of comfortable study environments. We have a dedicated area for undergraduate students to study, and the facility to reserve small rooms for the purpose of conducting group work. A wide range of academic books, e-resources, e-books and e-journals are also available, all of which can be accessed both on and off-site.

# COURSE LEVELS EXPLAINED

We offer a wide variety of study options and entry points for undergraduate study to suit all needs.

## HNC/HND

The BTEC Higher National Certificate (HNC) and Higher National Diploma (HND) are established qualifications that are widely recognised and highly regarded. We offer these in various, flexible modes of study, including part-time, block release, or evening options.

## FOUNDATION DEGREE

Foundation Degrees have been designed together with employers to meet the growing demand for skilled people who can apply an enhanced understanding of their subject in the workplace. You can either enter employment after completing the course or choose to "Top Up" to a full Honours degree.

## HONOURS DEGREE TOP-UP

Successful HND or Foundation Degree students who meet entry requirements, are eligible to progress on to a one-year, full-time course at Loughborough College, designed to "top up" their current qualification to a full Honours degree, awarded by our partner universities.

## HONOURS DEGREE

We now offer full three-year Honours degree courses, with our partner universities. Although you will study at Loughborough College, your final qualification will be awarded by the validating university itself and will be equivalent to receiving a degree directly from them.

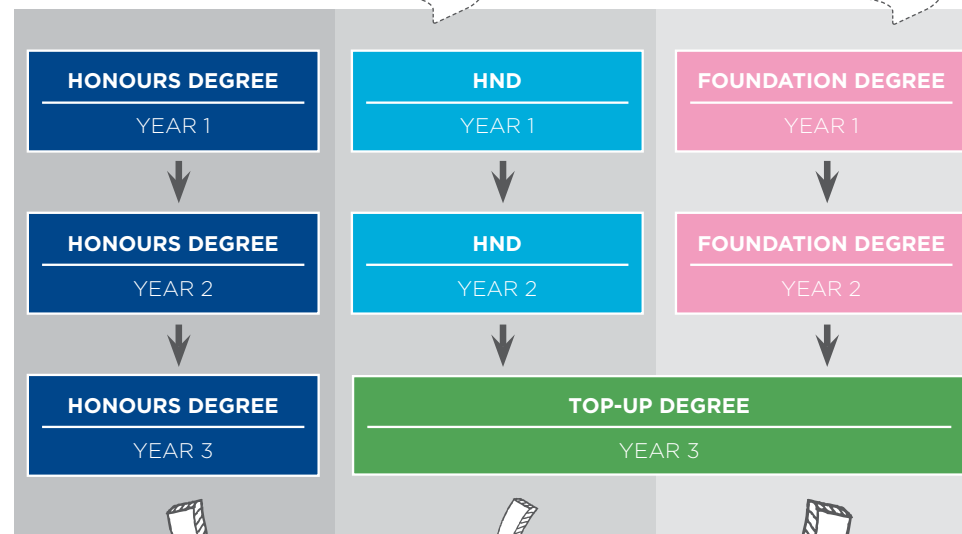

# STUDY OPTIONS

At Loughborough College, there's more than one route to gain a degree level qualification. We offer a range of ways to reach your personal goals.

## FULL-TIME

Most of our programmes are offered on a full-time basis and this is the quickest way to achieve your qualification.

## PART-TIME

A number of our programmes are also offered part-time. Although this will increase the amount of time it takes to complete your qualification, it means you have more time for other personal or work commitments.

## BLENDED LEARNING

We have a number of HND and Honours degrees that you can study full-time or part-time via blended learning. This way of studying provides the perfect combination of online learning which you can complete away from campus, coupled with a series of contact days throughout the year where you will benefit from face-to-face contact time with lecturers. This is ideal for those balancing their studies alongside professional, personal or sporting commitments.

## FLEXIBLE START POINTS

Some of our courses have more than one intake each year, meaning that you may not have to wait until September to start. A number of courses will also allow you to enter at different stages, depending on your existing qualifications. Please contact us to find out more information.
