



Civil Engineering Apprenticeship

In order to develop the skills of our young civil engineers and meet the growing needs for qualified practitioners in the island, CIGPE, Trackers Apprenticeship Programme and University College Jersey have created a partnership to deliver professional Civil Engineering qualifications to students here in Jersey, via an Apprenticeship pathway.

Qualifications available

- **HNC Higher Apprenticeship in Civil Engineering (2 Years)**

This post 18 option is open to candidates leaving school or sixth form with an A-level or Level 3 profile. It is also available as an entry-level qualification to those already working in industry and hold appropriate experience/qualification to undertake the course (see **Entry requirements** for more info).

Qualification

HNC in Civil Engineering from London South Bank University and Pearson/BTEC

Course structure

Delivered as a part-time, 1 day per week course, split into the following;

Year 1: Materials and geology, Construction practice and Engineering mechanics

Year 2: Structures and Construction technology, Engineering surveying and Mathematics

How does it work?

As an Apprenticeship pathway, the qualification allows candidates to study, whilst working full time in industry. Whilst the qualification is open to any candidates wanting to undertake it independently, our partnership with Trackers Apprenticeship Programme allows candidates to undertake the qualification fully funded through their employer and the Government of Jersey.

This partnership also includes dedicated mentoring from Trackers throughout the 2 years, which includes regular catch-ups where students receive impartial support and guidance, as well as reviews with employers to track progress and development throughout the year.

How much does it cost?

Costs to be confirmed.

Candidates applying through Trackers with the support of their employer can receive full funding via the following model:

If company annual turnover is over £300,000, funding is split 50:50 per year.

If company turnover is under £300,000, funding is split 75:25 (Trackers:Employer) per year.

Entry requirements

Candidates must be 18 or over and be employed in a relevant role in the Civil Engineering industry.

5 years residency required.

Grade profile

A Level EEE or;

BTEC National Diploma MPP or;

Access to HE qualifications with 45 Passes or;

Equivalent level 3 qualifications worth 48 UCAS points

Level 3 qualifications must include Maths and Physical Science

Applicants must hold 5 GCSEs A-C including Math's and English or equivalent (reformed GCSEs grade 4 or above).

Qualifications from around the world are also welcome for consideration. English language qualifications for international students: IELTS score of 6.0, Cambridge Proficiency, or Advanced Grade C.

When does it start?

Course commences in September 2021 and follows the school term dates.

Applications will be considered between now and July 2021.

- **BEng (Hons) Degree Apprenticeship in Civil Engineering (3 years)**

This course offers a progression route for those who have completed the HNC or a HND in another relevant subject, or candidates who have relevant industry experience and looking to progress their professional qualifications (see **Entry requirements** for more info).

Qualification

BEng (Hons) in Civil Engineering from London South Bank University

Course structure

Delivered as a part-time course (1 day & 1 evening per week) over three years. Modules are subject to change, but may include:

Hydraulics, Advanced Mathematics, Soil Mechanics, Structures and Design, Construction Management, Highway Engineering, Geotechnical Engineering, Environmental Engineering, and an individual research project

How does it work?

Equivalent level 3 qualifications worth 128 UCAS points (Level 3 qualifications must include Maths and Physics)

Applicants must hold 5 GCSEs A-C including Maths and English or equivalent (reformed GCSEs grade 4 or above)

Qualifications from around the world will be considered. English language qualifications for international students: IELTS score of 6.0, Cambridge Proficiency or Advanced Grade C.
