Jersey Overseas Aid, Jersey's official aid agency, offers opportunities throughout the year for Islanders to get involved in international development and contribute to worthwhile projects abroad. Our Community Work Projects (CWPs) are open to everyone and have been a core element of our work since 1972. Through our different bursary programmes professionals, young people or career-changers can access financial support to exchange and share knowledge whilst learning new skills and experiencing new cultures. Meanwhile, JOA's paid internship offers the rare opportunity for a Jersey resident to gain practical experience overseas, paving the way for a career in a notoriously difficult sector to crack.

Jersey's overseas aid work not only represents the best of our caring, outward-looking Island; it actively contributes to the strength and vibrancy of our own community. # Our Community Work Projects

For nearly 50 years Jersey residents have brought life-changing benefits to those most in need. Jersey volunteers have brought clean water to those without, built classrooms, orphanages and clinics where there have been none, and provided one-to-one care for those who have no one. For many it is a once-in-alifetime opportunity, bringing with it a sense of achievement, life-long friendships and extraordinary memories.

The projects require no prior experience, and - unlike many organised overseas volunteer programmes – offer good value for money that achieve realistic and need-orientated goals. Projects are typically two to three weeks, and made up of between 8 and 12 individuals led by an experienced leader. Each participant contributes a modest amount towards their own travel expenses and JOA funds the additional costs of travel, plus insurance, medical kits, vaccinations, food and accommodation. JOA also funds all the materials and supplies necessary in order to complete the projects.

Conditions can be challenging and there are few creature comforts, but being part of an Overseas Aid project team is a highly rewarding experience. We ask very little in return but all potential team members will need to be interviewed and, in addition to being physically fit, we ask all participants to remember they are Jersey ambassadors when they are abroad.

Leading a CWP adds an additional sense of achievement, not to mention a higher level of responsibility and organisation. Aside from personal expenses, CWP leaders will not be expected to contribute towards the project.

# JOA's Professional Bursary

Transferring knowledge and providing technical assistance is one of the most efficient forms of aid. It can also greatly benefit the individual who is sharing their skills in a new context - deepening proficiency, adding new perspectives and experience, and providing a great sense of professional satisfaction.

JOA's Professional Bursary Programme enables Jersey residents with relevant skills to spend time overseas utilising their expertise to help communities and organisations in need of professional assistance. We provide funding of up to £4,000 for extended placements abroad, sometimes partnering with employers who realise this is a great way to develop staff as well as to give something back.

Maybe you're a social worker who could help traumatised Syrian refugee children, an accountant who can get a Nepali charity's financial management in order, or an IT expert who can take an East African social enterprise to a new level, we'd love to hear from you. # JOA's Internship – A Stepping-Stone to a Career in International Development



Whilst a career in international development can be incredibly rewarding, getting your first job can be hard. This exciting internship programme – run in partnership with leading UK charities - gives someone from Jersey the chance to spend twelve months learning the ropes with the professionals, including six months on assignment in a developing country.

The main goal is to equip the successful candidate with the skills and experience necessary to enable them to take frontline roles with international relief and development organisations.

The intern spends two months in JOA's office in St Helier, before transferring to the partner's UK headquarters where they will have an opportunity to work in a number of departments across the organisation. Full support will be provided throughout the year and a mentor will be appointed who will oversee learning. They will then be ready for their first field posting, in one of the charity's overseas projects.

No age limit applies, and career-changers are welcome - we look to recruit individuals who are serious about embarking on a fulfilling but demanding new path, including being prepared to spend significant time in challenging places.

# JOA HAS FOUR PRIMARY FUNDING THEMES:







JERSEY OVERSEAS CHARITIES



Jersey Overseas Aid is governed by **six unpaid Commissioners**, three States members and three non-States members, who are appointed by the States of Jersey. They are ultimately responsible to the States and are the final arbiters of all funding decisions. The Chair of the Commission represents Jersey as the Island's Minister for International Development.





### **01.** International Development Grants

These are multi-year projects awarded to registered UK and international charities. Jersey concentrates its major development grants on a handful of carefully-chosen themes, such as Dairy and Financial Inclusion, selected for their effectiveness in bringing lasting change to the lives of the poor and for being areas where the skills and knowledge on the Island can be used to add particular value.



### 02. Emergency & Disaster Relief

Jersey has been present at nearly every major global emergency since JOA's foundation, responding to hurricanes, droughts, famine, earthquakes, and outbreaks of disease. The Island also supports civilians affected by conflict, particularly in Yemen and Syria, some of the worst humanitarian crises in a generation. Having received humanitarian aid ourselves, we're proud to be in a position to save innocent lives abroad.



### 03. Jersey Overseas Charities

Jersey-based charities actively implement projects all over the developing world. In 2017, JOA donated almost £1m to Jersey organisations conducting life-changing work in 11 countries.



### 04. Community Work Projects & Bursaries

Since 1972 Jersey has sent Islanders to volunteer for a few weeks on projects abroad. They bring a personal message that Jersey cares, and in many cases create enduring links between communities in Jersey and developing countries.
