

## BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

LJMU has something exciting coming soon. Our new development on Copperas Hill will be a brilliant addition to the vibrant Mount Pleasant Campus, providing LJMU students with a Student Life Building and Sports Building. Expect a central meeting point for all students and staff, with spaces to relax, study and train, connecting both City and Mount Pleasant Campus\*.

### CITY CAMPUS

**Home to the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Science, School of Nursing and Allied Health, and Public Health Institute.**

The City Campus, situated in the heart of Liverpool, is close to some of the city's most impressive attractions, comprising of the Walker Art Gallery, Central Library, World Museum and St George's Hall. Teaching buildings include the James Parsons Building, Henry Cotton Building, Tom Reilly Building and Avril Roberts Library.

Due for completion in September 2020, we are extending and refurbishing our Tithebarn Building – home to the School of Nursing and Allied Health. The project will deliver state-of-the-art specialist practice simulation suites to help prepare our students for their future careers.



### MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS

**Home to the School of Law, Liverpool Business School, Liverpool School of Art and Design, School of Humanities and Social Science, Liverpool Centre for Advanced Policing Studies and School of Education.**

Mount Pleasant Campus is close to the theatres, independent cafés and bars of the Georgian Quarter. This campus captures the creative and entrepreneurial spirit of Liverpool. Buildings include the RIBA award-winning John Lennon Art and Design Building, John Foster Building, Redmonds Building and J H Makin Drama Studio, along with Aldham Roberts Library.

**CITY CENTRE**

**Liverpool city centre** is like something out of a movie (most of the time because it is, from the likes of *Peaky Blinders* to *Fantastic Beasts* and *Where to Find Them*) – with the finest buildings being found on William Brown Street. Elsewhere the city is a lively area with shops aplenty.

**BALTIC TRIANGLE**

This self-aware hip neighbourhood was voted one of the coolest places to live in the UK by *The Times*\*. The warehouses are home to an increasing roll call of street food venues, unique bars, design studios and outdoor social spaces, alongside a blooming metropolis of new apartment buildings.

**ROPEWALKS**

In the past, this area was central to Liverpool's maritime rope manufacturing industry, now the cobbled streets between **Duke Street** and **Bold Street** are home to some of the coolest bars and eateries of the city. This independently minded retail and entertainment quarter is the perfect introduction to Liverpool.

**GEORGIAN QUARTER**

One of the prettiest parts of town, Liverpool's **Georgian Quarter** has two cathedrals heading up either end of **Hope Street** and is full of elegant Georgian architecture, genteel squares, two theatres, loads of great places to eat and a traditional English pub scene.

## 5 COMMERCIAL DISTRICT

Liverpool's business district is home to an American-inspired grid of streets filled with ornate banking halls, lofty skyscrapers and eye-catching late 19th century office buildings. Hunt out the secret roof gardens.

## 6 KNOWLEDGE QUARTER

They call the top end of town the **Knowledge Quarter** and there's a simple reason for this; it is where smart folk like you will spend most of your time. Nestled in beside the University of Liverpool, the walkways that link our two universities are a mix of Victorian gothic and 60s modernism alongside hi-tech new centres of learning. This is where great things happen.

## 7 WATERFRONT

Full of life and spectacularly beautiful, Liverpool's world-class waterfront is UNESCO protected and you can learn all about its history at the Museum of Liverpool, facing the Mersey. Great for a walk to clear the head, a pit stop in one of the many bars or coffee shops, or to enjoy events hosted at the **Royal Albert Dock** (pirate festivals, live music and tall ships, to name just a few).

### DOWN THE HATCH

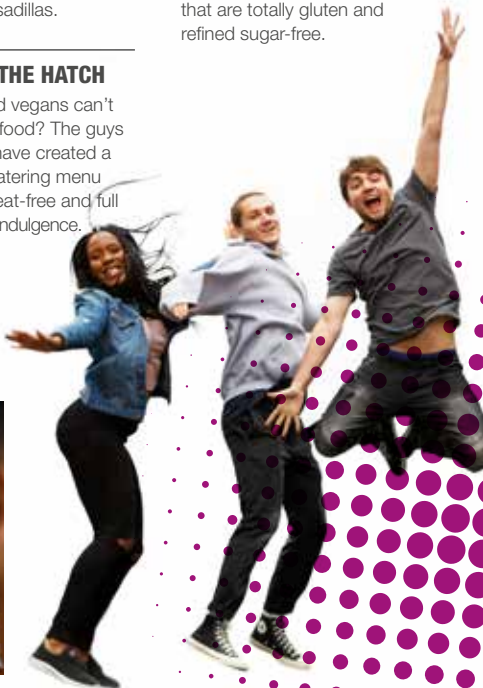
Who said vegans can't eat junk food? The guys at DTH have created a mouthwatering menu that's meat-free and full of carby indulgence.

## ART AND CULTURE

With more museums and galleries than any other city outside of London, there is a lot of inspirational art and culture for you to experience in Liverpool. The city celebrates its creative past, present and future with world-renowned collections at the Walker Art Gallery and Tate Liverpool plus works on display at the Open Eye Gallery, FACT, Bluecoat and Liverpool Biennial of Contemporary Art.

## FILM AND THEATRE

Take your pick from West End touring shows at Liverpool's **Empire Theatre**, independent performances at the **Unity**, **Playhouse** and **Everyman** theatres or blockbuster films across multiple screens, art-house cinemas and more.





# MUSEUMS

There are several museums across Liverpool, charting the history of the city and its impact on the wider-world, from the darker side of its maritime past to the swinging sixties. There are plenty of options (free entry for most) in the city centre alone: **Museum of Liverpool, Maritime Museum, International Slavery Museum, The Beatles Story, World Museum** and **British Music Experience**.



## FAITH

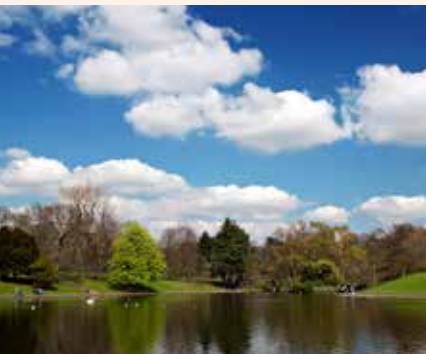
We are a multiracial, multicultural city supporting a diverse range of religions and communities. The two cathedrals – Anglican and Roman Catholic – may dominate the skyline but Greek orthodox, Unitarian and numerous European churches can be found across Liverpool.

The mosque at 8 Brougham Terrace was the first to be established in England and the Al Rahma mosque near the city centre holds up to 1,000 people. Liverpool also has a thriving Jewish community and the Princes Road Synagogue is one of the finest buildings in the city. Nigerian, Somalian and Sikh communities are well established, alongside a Hindu temple on Edge Lane and active Buddhist centre in Aigburth.





## GREEN SPACES AND BEACHES



Picnic, revision session or bike ride, whatever your reason to reconnect with nature there is lots to entice you out of the city and into one of our green spaces or local beaches. Explore the likes of Sefton Park (and Lark Lane for bohemian café culture) or take some time out in John Foster Gardens. A short train ride will see you on the beach at Crosby, where you can admire Anthony Gormley's **'Another Place'** iron men (15 minutes from Liverpool Central) or Formby beach and National Trust squirrel walk (in 30 minutes).





## SPORT IN THE CITY



Sport is big in Liverpool. From Premier League football (we have two world-renowned teams and the city is pretty obsessed with the beautiful game) to the spectacle of the Grand National at Aintree, water sports (we're a port-city after all) and a promenade that is perfect for runners, strollers and Instagrammers alike. Maintaining that sport is for everyone, we have a whole host of clubs and societies through John Moores Students' Union that provide fun opportunities to try new and established sports, competitively or socially. There is even a Sports Scholarship programme for serious competitors, supporting elite athletes to train and study at the same time.

# THE **FACTS** ABOUT WHAT YOUR UNIVERSITY EDUCATION WILL COST AND HOW YOU CAN PAY

- You will be charged a tuition fee for every year of your course. In 2020 LJMU will charge a tuition fee of £9,250\* for all full-time undergraduate degree programmes.
- You don't have to pay tuition fees up front – subject to eligibility, you can take out a tuition fee loan for each year of your course. This is paid direct to the University.
- You can also take out a maintenance loan to cover your living expenses such as rent and food. This loan is paid direct to you in three instalments.
- Dependent upon where you live in the UK, you may also qualify for grants for living costs too.
- You don't start paying back your student loan until you have left university and are earning over the threshold. The current threshold is £25,725 for students from England and Wales, £18,935 for students from Northern Ireland and Scotland.
- Your monthly repayments will be a percentage of your earnings and are not based on how much you borrowed from the Student Loans Company.
- You may also be eligible for additional funding that doesn't have to be paid back, but this depends on your household income.
- LJMU offers a fantastic range of targeted support for students from lower income households plus scholarships for talented and academically gifted students.
- Additional support is also available for students with disabilities, students with children or students who have been in care or are estranged from their families.

Funding figures relate to students normally resident in England. Different funding arrangements will apply if you are from Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland or the EU. For further information visit the following websites:

# HOW TO APPLY

## Applications for full-time undergraduate applications

To apply to study on a full-time undergraduate course at LJMU you will need to submit an online application through UCAS. The 'Apply' service at [ucas.com](https://ucas.com) allows you to fill in your application anytime, anywhere (please note: there is an application fee for this service and deadlines apply).

You have the option of choosing five courses on your UCAS application. You can apply for just one course or use all five choices; you can also apply for more than one course at any institution.

## Filling in your UCAS application form

When we consider your UCAS application, your ability to achieve the entry criteria is just one of the areas we take into account. An important part of the application form is your personal statement, which is your opportunity to tell us more about yourself. You should include your skills, relevant interests and hobbies, along with why you want to study the course. Any work experience or voluntary work should be mentioned here, but don't just state where and when, tell us about what you have learnt and what you enjoyed. We are looking for motivation, commitment and enthusiasm. This is your opportunity to convince us why you would like to study at LJMU.

Occasionally courses listed here may change throughout the year; new courses may become available or courses may be changed. So please check the UCAS website [ucas.com](https://ucas.com) and the LJMU website [ljmu.ac.uk/courses](https://ljmu.ac.uk/courses) which contain the most up-to-date listings.

# WHEN TO APPLY

You can apply through UCAS for 2021-entry from mid-September, 2020. To ensure equal consideration of your application the deadline for all LJMU programmes is **15 January 2021**; some universities might have different dates, so please check carefully. Universities receive applications throughout the year and applications may be considered outside the formal UCAS deadlines through UCAS Extra.

## Applying for deferred entry

LJMU is pleased to consider applications for most programmes for deferred entry, however please check prior to submitting your form. You can do this online at [ljmu.ac.uk/courses](https://ljmu.ac.uk/courses).

## Applications for part-time, degree apprenticeships and postgraduate programmes

Applications for part-time, degree apprenticeships and the majority of postgraduate programmes should be made directly to LJMU and we welcome applications throughout the year.

**Applications from mature students (aged 21+) are guaranteed to be given additional consideration, relating to your relevant academic, professional and life experiences.**

## MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For all our courses there will be a minimum UCAS Tariff score requirement. In addition, many courses will ask for specific subjects at GCSE and/or A level or equivalent. If a GCSE subject is required you will always need at least a Grade C or Grade 4.

## AS LEVELS

To ensure that we are fair and consistent when considering all applications we take a holistic view looking at all aspects of the application including GCSE (or equivalent) grades, references and your personal statement as well as information gained at interviews or auditions. We are aware that not every A level student will have the opportunity to study AS levels and this will be taken into consideration when assessing your application; a fourth subject at AS level is not essential.

## APPLICANTS RETURNING TO EDUCATION

For students aged over 21 who have gained substantial knowledge or experience in a particular area, formal qualifications may not be essential. However, you will have to provide evidence of your ability to study at degree level through an interview or portfolio of work.

## WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR APPLICATION FORM?

Your application form is sent to us by UCAS and we assess your form on its merits as quickly and efficiently as possible. For some programmes decisions are based entirely on your application form; others will require you to undertake an interview, short assessment test, show your portfolio of work or undertake an audition. Details of additional forms of assessment are included in our entry criteria.

## THE OFFER PROCESS

**There are a number of offers that we can make you**

- An **unconditional offer** - this will be made if you already satisfy the entrance criteria (i.e. you may be a mature student or already have the results of your examinations).
- A **conditional offer** - this will be made if you have yet to sit your examinations, and you will be advised of the grades and other criteria we would like you to fulfil.
- A **changed course offer** - if we have read through your application form and think that you would be best suited to a different course, we will contact you to offer you an alternative unconditional or conditional offer for another course. You do not have to accept this offer should you not wish to do so.

## APPLICANT DAY EVENTS

Once an offer has been made, we will invite you to a course-specific Applicant Day, interview or audition where you will have an opportunity to meet current staff and students, see the facilities in more detail, and find out about our student accommodation.

## MAKING YOUR FIRM AND INSURANCE CHOICES

Once you have received decisions back from all your choices, you will be asked to decide which two offers you wish to accept. You will have to choose which you wish to make 'Firm' (your first choice) and which you wish to make 'Insurance' (your second choice).

## UCAS EXTRA

If you have applied for all your five choices through UCAS but are not successful in gaining a place or you have declined all the offers you received you will be eligible for UCAS Extra. UCAS Extra runs from February to July.

## RECEIVING YOUR RESULTS

You will automatically be accepted if you meet the requirements of your conditional firm (CF) offer with LJMU. If you do not attain the required grades, then we may still accept you on your chosen programme or offer you an alternative programme. If your application is unsuccessful you will then be considered by your 'insurance' choice.

## CLEARING

Clearing is an additional opportunity to get a place at university, starting a course in September 2021. If you are late to apply, or do not fulfil the conditions of your conditional or unconditional choices, you can then enter the Clearing process. During Clearing you contact universities directly to establish if you can be accepted onto one of their courses. Clearing will take place from July to September.
