Canadian universities are all public universities, governed by the province or territory that they are in.

In some areas, like Ontario, this leads to a central application system, while in others you apply to each university through their own system.

This also means that there is a big range of options available to you, including the option to study in French in Quebec (and indeed beyond).



# UNI IN CANADA

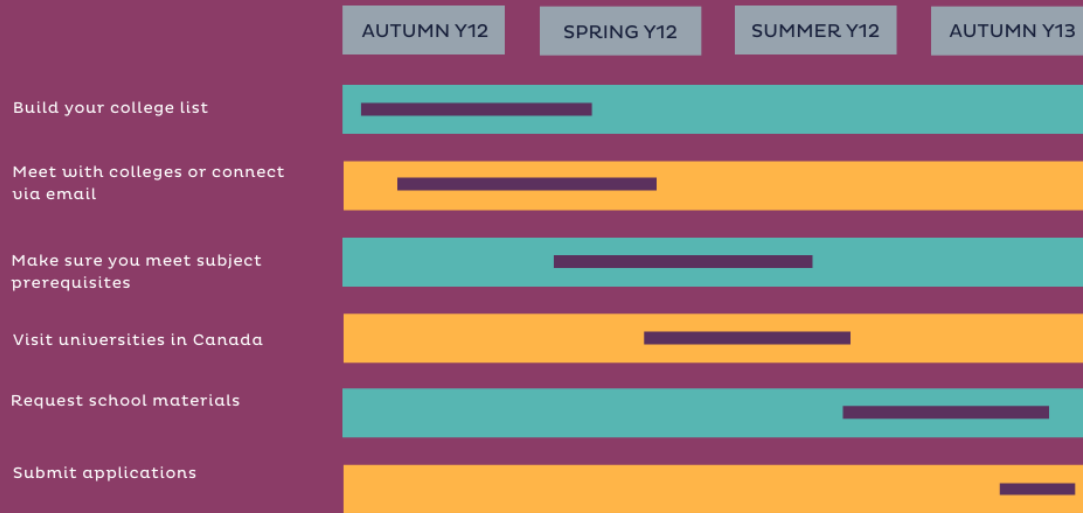

## FAQ

### DO I NEED THE SAT?

Canadian universities do not require the SAT or ACT for students studying A Levels, the IB Diploma or BTEC, so there's no need to take these entrance tests.

### WILL I GET INTO A GOOD UNI?

Canadian universities have relatively transparent requirements, so it's quite easy to see which universities you are eligible for. Alongside this, Canada does not have any undergraduate university league tables, as there is a high-quality of provision across all Canadian universities.

### IS APPLYING A LOT OF WORK?

Compared to US applications, applying to Canada is very straightforward. The complexity can come in dealing with different application portals for each province or university, and the various documents, interviews and essays that might be needed after you have submitted your initial application
