THREE TOP TIPS

- Each country's system will work differently, and often can seem to work on a very different way to what you may be used to. Remember, each university system has to make sense for students from that country.
- 2. Don't assume that university in another country will work like it does in your's - you may find some things that are very different.
- 3. Understand what the fees will be based on which passports you have, it can change things quite a lot

WHAT EXAMS DO I NEED TO DO?

Most European countries will assess your application based on your A Levels, IB Diploma or BTEC, but some selective programmes may also ask you to take entrances tests as well.

WILL I GET INTO A GOOD UNI?

Many European university systems have many 'open access' courses, where world-class universities are accessible with relatively low entry requirements. However, there can be selection 'after the gate' from Year 1 into Year 2, particularly in some public university systems.

IS APPLYING A LOT OF WORK?

It can be, depending on where you apply. Some systems, such as in Belgium or Ireland, have very streamlined systems, whereas in others there is going to be a lot of complexity in the process
